The Fifty Day Count to Pentecost: 2019

During the Feast of Unleavened Bread, we begin preparing for the next festival, the Feast of Weeks, known in the New Testament as Pentecost. We have not yet finished one festival, and we begin preparing for the next one.

Of all the festivals mentioned in Leviticus 23 and Deuteronomy 16, this is the only one that doesn't have a specific calendar date. The day on which Pentecost is observed is determined by counting a certain number of days, with the last day being the festival. We begin this count on the Sunday, "the day after the Sabbath" (Leviticus 23:9-16) that falls within the week of the Feast of Unleavened Bread. The most popular name for this festival in the Bible is the "Feast of Weeks," because calculating the date of the festival involves counting seven weeks or Sabbaths, from the day of the Wave Sheaf Offering. With the day after the seventh Sabbath, a Sunday, being the Feast of Weeks (Exodus 34:22; Leviticus 23:15-16; Numbers 28:26; Deuteronomy 16:9-10, 16; 2 Chronicles 8:12-13). This is a total count of fifty days. The exact date on the calendar may vary from year to year, but the feast day is always a Sunday. Although the old covenant sacrificial system has ceased, as Christians we continue to observe the Feast of Weeks. Still determining the count from the day of the wave sheaf offering by ancient Israel.

The following is a list of readings from the Book of Acts to be read during the fifty-day count to Pentecost. These readings will focus on the role of the Holy Spirit in the early Church. Besides, reading from Book of Acts on Sunday thru Friday. On the seven weekly Sabbaths there will be a collection of Bible Study Notes about the Holy Spirit: *Old Testament Prophecies*

about the coming of the Holy Spirit, John and the coming Holy Spirit, Jesus and the coming of the Holy Spirit, Jesus, the giver of the Holy Spirit, The work of the Holy Spirit in the believer, Using the Spirit of Pentecost Part 1, and Using the Spirit of Pentecost Part 2.1

Counting to Pentecost 1st Day - April 21, Wave Sheaf Sunday

On the Sunday occurring during the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the Israelites made a special offering called the wave sheaf. On this day, the high priest would wave a sheaf of the firstfruits of the barley harvest before God. This was the first sheaf of grain harvested during the spring harvest season (Leviticus 23:9-14).

On the morning of the wave sheaf offering, the Sunday following Jesus' death, during the Feast of Unleavened Bread. Mary Magdalene came to Jesus' tomb and found it empty (John 20:1-2). Jesus had already risen and left his tomb before the close of the weekly Sabbath.

Sometime later on Sunday, Jesus appears to Mary who was the first person Jesus showed himself to after his resurrection (Mark 16:9). In her excitement at seeing Jesus, Mary reaches out to hug him. But, Jesus tells her not to touch him because he hadn't yet ascended to the Father in heaven (John 20:11-18). After Jesus' meeting with Mary Magdalene, he appears to the other women who had gone to the tomb with her (Mark 16:1-2; Luke 23:55-24:1), allowing them to touch him (Matthew 28:5, 8-9).

This indicates that some time between Jesus' meeting with Mary (John 20:17) and the meeting with the other women (Matthew 28:9), he ascended to the Father in heaven. All this happened on the day of the wave sheaf offering, during the Feast of Unleavened Bread. On the same day, the High Priest waved a sheaf of firstfruits before God. Jesus having risen "from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen

asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20; also see Colossians 1:18; Acts 26:23). Ascended to heaven as the first person resurrected to eternal life. Jesus is the firstfruits of those resurrected from the dead, with those belonging to him resurrected at his second coming (1 Corinthians 15:20-23, 50-55; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18).

As the Passover lamb represents the slain Jesus. The wave sheaf offering represents the resurrected Jesus rising to heaven, as the firstfruits of many more that will one day also rise from the dead. Wave sheaf Sunday doesn't picture Jesus' resurrection, but his ascension to heaven.

The fifty day or seven-week count to Pentecost begins on this day, the day after the Sabbath (which is Sunday), that falls during the Days of Unleavened Bread (Leviticus 23:15-16, 21; Deuteronomy 16:9-10).

Old Testament Prophecies about the Coming of the Holy Spirit

- 1) The sending of the Holy Spirit is compared to the pouring out of water (Isaiah 44:1-5).
 - a) In the New Testament, the Holy Spirit is compared to water (John 7:37-39).
- 2) The New Covenant deals with the heart, the inward man and receiving the Holy Spirit (Jeremiah 31:31-34).
 - a) God knew from the start that Israel would not obey, they lacked the "heart" to do it (Deuteronomy 5:27-33).
 - b) Israel did not have the "heart" or ability to understand and obey God (Deuteronomy 29:1-4).
 - c) A fleshly mind, one without the Holy Spirit, does not want to obey God (Romans 8:1-11).
- 3) The sending of the Holy Spirit makes it possible to obey God (Ezekiel 11:14-21; 36:22-27).
- 4) Putting God's Spirit in people (Ezekiel 37:13-14).
- 5) The outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Ezekiel 39:25-29).
- 6) The outpouring of the Holy Spirit on mankind (Joel 2:28-32).
 - a) In explaining why Jesus' followers were speaking in tongues on the Day of Pentecost. The apostle Peter quotes these verses from Joel (Acts 2:1-21).

John and the coming Holy Spirit

- "'As for me [John], I baptize you with water for repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you with the **Holy Spirit** and fire" (Matthew 3:11).
- 2) "And he [John] was preaching, and saying, 'After me One is coming who is mightier than I, and I am not fit to stoop down and untie the thong of His sandals. I baptized you with water; but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit'" (Mark 1:7-8).

The work of the Holy Spirit in the believer

- 5) Through the Holy Spirit, we receive power (Acts 1:8; Romans 15:13; Ephesians 3:16; 2 Timothy 1:7).
- 6) Through the Holy Spirit, we put to death the deeds of the flesh (Romans 8:13).
- 7) Through the Holy Spirit, we become the sons of God (Romans 8:14-17, 23).8).
- 8) The Holy Spirit helps us in our prayer life (Romans 8:26-27).
- 9) The Holy Spirit baptizes us into the Church (1 Corinthians 12:13).
- 10) Through the Holy Spirit, we receive freedom and liberty (2 Corinthians 3:17).
- 11) We have fellowship with the Holy Spirit (2 Corinthians 13:14; Philippians 2:1).
- 12) We receive eternal life through the Holy Spirit (Galatians 6:8).
- 13) We have access to the Father by the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 2:18).
- 14) The Holy Spirit regenerates and renews us (Titus 3:3-7).
- 15) The Holy Spirit sanctifies us (1 Peter 1:2).

Using the Spirit of Pentecost Part 1

- 1) As the firstfruits of those receiving the Spirit (Romans 8:22-23), we have a responsibility to use the Spirit, making sure not to quench it (1 Thessalonians 5:19).
- 2) The parables of the Talents and Pounds teach us that God will hold us accountable for what He gives us, and this includes the Holy Spirit (Matthew 25:14-30; Luke 19:11-27).
- 3) The Spirit makes it possible for us to do three things: 1) Obey God, 2) Produce spiritual fruit, 3) Use our spiritual gifts.
- 4) Obedience through the Spirit
 - a) When we receive the Holy Spirit, we have the laws of God written on our hearts. This Spirit makes obedience to God possible (Jeremiah 31:31-34; Ezekiel. 11:19-21; Ezekiel. 36:22-27; Hebrews 8:7-13; Romans 8:1-9).
 - b) God gives the Holy Spirit to those who obey. The more we obey, the more Spirit we receive (Acts 5:27-32).
- 5) We can lose the Spirit because of not obeying God, or at least lessen its effect in our lives (Psalm 51:10-12).
 - (1) Saul received the Holy Spirit when Samuel anointed him king of Israel (1 Samuel 10:1, 6-13). Later as a result of Saul's sin in not obeying God's command to destroy the Amalekites, God took the kingdom of Israel from Saul and gave it to David (1 Samuel 15-16), as well as taking His Spirit from Saul (1 Samuel 16:14).

(2) When we sin, we grieve the Spirit. It appears we damage its impact on our lives (Isaiah 63:10; Acts 7:51; Ephesians 4:30).

Using the Spirit of Pentecost Part 2

 On the Sixth Sabbath, we examined using the Spirit to obey God. This week we will look at producing spiritual fruit and using spiritual gifts

2) Fruit of the Spirit

- a) The "natural" outcome of living a life of obedience, living by the Spirit, is producing spiritual fruit (Galatians 5:16-26).
- b) We produce spiritual fruit by abiding in Jesus (John 15:1-17).
 - (1) Those who are unfruitful are taken away and burned (John 15:2, 6); clearly a reference to being cast into the Lake of Fire (Matthew 25:41-46; Revelation 20:10).
- 3) Gifts of the Spirit
 - a) We have a responsibility to use our spiritual gifts (1 Corinthians 12:1-11, 27-31; Romans 12:4-8; Ephesians 4:4-13; 1 Peter 4:9-11).
 - b) We have a duty to use our spiritual gifts since the Spirit is under our control:"The spirits of prophets are subject to prophets" (1 Corinthians 14:31-32).
